# Register Now for Regional International Blues Challenge Solo/Duo Competition

he Blues Foundation presents the International Blues Challenge in Memphis, TN every winter. Bands from around the world compete for wider recognition and a coveted spot performing on the Legendary Rhythm & Blues Cruise. 2004 IBC winner, Zac Harmon, said that winning the competition was worth more than \$100,000 in publicity.

BLUSD sends a band or solo/duo act each year plus submits a self-produced CD, and the results thus far have been very impressive. Nathan James and Ben Hernandez won for best solo/duo act in 2007. Aunt Kizzy's Boys placed second in the band category in 2006. Sue Palmer won in the Best Self-Produced CD category in 2008.

Preliminary rounds for the 2013 Solo/Duo IBC will be held on October 13 and 20. The finals will take place on November 3. Now is the time for all of you talented musicians to register to participate. BLUSD member fees are \$15 an non-member fees are \$50. You will receive a discounted entry fee by registering prior to September 1.



The regional competition will follow the rules of the IBC as posted by the Blues Foundation at www.blues.org. Scoring will be based on blues content, vocals, talent, originality and stage presence. All sets will be 25 minutes. The lineup playing for your act at the prelims must be the same lineup that will play in the finals and, if you win, in Memphis at the IBC finals to be held January 29-February 2, 2013. Winners will play a send-off fundraiser in January. Winners will receive \$750 per musician for hotel and travel costs.



## **CD Reviews**



#### BEYOND THE CROSSROADS Sue Foley / Peter Karp Blind Pig Records

One of the best releases I have heard in far too long! This collection of tunes is a beautifully written group of works that pin-points the

challenges of love, tragedy, and perseverance. With lyrics that make you want to cry and laugh at the same time the delightful light hearted way the message in each song is crafted and weaved into a rhythm and melody that reflect its deepest meaning. I caught myself saying "Damn, I wish I had said that!". The sarcasm is biting and witty, with the point delivered like an arrow straight through the heart. The raw tribal drum beats set a back drop for the sexy masculine rasp of Peter Karp's vocals which are topped with the sweet, gentle, and gracefully aged sound of Sue Foley's distinctive vocal style. I've been following Sue Foley and Peter Karp individually for decades and yet together they have successfully make a totally new yet familiar sound that only these two artists can claim. #### FOURTEEN STORIES Red Lotus Revue

Listening to Fourteen Stories is like happening into the back room of some small-town business where the after-hours linger and the hippest musicians around play like they have nowhere to go.



These songs – by the likes of Jimmy Reed, Sonny Boy Williamson II and Big Smokey Smothers as well as Red Lotus Revue harmonica player-singer Karl Cabbage and guitarist Jimmy Zollo. – have well-defined pacing to give them a particular feel. Even the songs written in the second decade of the twenty-first century sound worn and comfortable to the fit.

Zollo and guitarist Pete Fazzini have a sychronicity and Cabbage knows just right notes to hit on his harmonica and sings with conviction. Drummer Kurt Kalker is always steady, but his percussive touches on the CD's first cut, "Suzanne," are extraordinary mood-settings. Unfortunately, Kalker, who engineered this CD, recently left the band.

A highlight of the CD is the band's molasses-like "Honest I Do." Cabbage reworks the Jimmy Reed song to make it even more plaintive than the original. It is a masterpiece of emotion in his hands.

Red Lotus is a band whose strength comes knowing what it wants to do and each member executing that precisely. This is a great example of what a band can be. ~ Michael Kinsman

#### WHERE THE BLUES LIVES 145th Street 145th Street Music

This album is a Saturday night blues party in a box. Just load it up in your player, add friends and refreshments and you're guaranteed to have a good time. In the liner notes, the band



offers an earnestly-given toast to its CD audience: "To all those who listen, may you enjoy the music." Then, they pull out all the stops to make it happen.

From the opening harmonica riffs of the title song, the first track on the CD, they will have you jumping to your feet and dancing. Before you can even think of sitting down, they follow up with another fast-paced, kick-up-your-feet number, "Tell Me Baby." They accentuate the party experience with sexy lyrics aimed at the good-time Saturday night crowd.

They're arguably at their best with the driving, jumping, grooving dance music on tracks such as "Where the Blues Lives," itself, "Blues Never Sleeps," and "Give Her What She Wants." However, these rousing party tunes are interspersed with a few slower, hypnotic "belly-rubbin" numbers, such as "Before I's Time," "What Am I S'posed To Do?" and "Good Mornin' Blues" that give the guitar and saxophone extra opportunities to shine with some engaging solos.

Blues lovers in San Diego will be familiar with this popular local band, consisting of Steve Bulger on harp and vocals, Marc Marrewa on guitar, Walter Gentry on sax, Brian Craig on Bass and Tony Peterson on drums. The live club performance experience carries through onto *Where The Blues Lives*. What you hear on the stage is what you'll get on this disc. You can have your Saturday night any time of the day, any day of the week. ~DM

#### DOUBLE DYNAMITE Mannish Boys Delta Groove

Upon listening to the first song of this double CD release, I was hooked to hearing every song. The Mannish Boys give true blues lovers something to be cherished. The sound is true to the Blues. I could not help but play *Double Dynamite* over and



over again. As a blues musician myself, I enjoyed the different styles of blues that were presented. The song selection of covers were great. Every song caught my ear and let me hear the devotion to the blues. I would recommend this CD to many different groups of people - musicians, blues lovers, music students or just anybody that wants to listen to good music. The quality of the recording speaks for itself. Good, solid, soul-felt music. To me, the Mannish Boys is the sound that has evolved from the way it was, to what it is today. ## Let's talk about Matt and Nikki Hill...

he Hills, the husband and wife team of Matt and Nikki Hill, are performing in San Diego on August 12th, 7-10 pm at Lacey J's Roadhouse, (8861 No. Magnolia, Santee); their first stop on their "California Invasion Tour." Sharing this BLUSD Table Gig event are Nathan James & The Rhythm Scratchers.

Matt Hill, winner of the 2011 Blues Music Awards for Best New Artist Debut, is one of the most talked about and electrifying acts on the scene today. Onstage, Hill is uninhibited, driving audiences wild with his whatever-it-takes boundless stage antics. His voice, guitar playing and magnetic energy will surely take him straight to the top.

The North Carolina native started playing live in his teens and eventually began playing with local blues icons Max Drake and Chuck Cotton in a band called The Buzzkillz plus sitting in with Bob Margolin. Soon Matt was joining Bob Margolin on tour, playing with the likes of blues heroes like Carey Bell, Hubert Sumlin, Willie "Big Eyes" Smith, Calvin "Fuzz" Jones, Pinetop Perkins, and Nappy Brown. Somewhere along the line, Matt developed a totally uninhibited, ferociously raving stage presence that harkens back to the heydays of Howlin' Wolf, Jerry Lee Lewis and Nappy Brown.

In September 2010 the Vizztone Label Group released Matt's debut album *On The Floor*. The CD received great reviews and in May 2011, won the award for Best New Artist Debut at the Blues Music Awards (formerly the W.C. Handy Awards) in Memphis TN. A couple of months later, Matt was also nominated for two awards at the Blues Blast Awards in Chicago IL. One for "Best New Artist Debut" and the other for the "Sean Costello Rising Star Award."

The follow up to *On The Floor*, titled *Tappin' That Thing*, was recorded at Felix Reye's House Of Tone and was released May 29th on Deep Fryed Records / The Vizztone Label Group.

Those who have seen Miss Nikki Hill sing her ass off agree—this isn't just another newcomer on the scene, this is a 'whiplash' moment. Where did this fireball come from? Why haven't I heard of her before? If you haven't heard of Nikki Hill yet, you soon will, and once you see her perform, you won't forget her.

Hill draws on vintage female rhythm and blues influences such as LaVern Baker, Etta James and Ruth Brown, as well as some of her favorite male singers, Otis Redding and Solomon Burke, without being stuck or pigeonholed strictly as a Retro artist. Her tough vocal style fits with contemporary sensibilities yet evokes all the great female blues shouters of previous decades. With the success of similar artists such as Amy Winehouse or Imelda May, Hill is poised to blaze her own trail in their wake.

Hailing from Durham, North Carolina, Hill comes by her Deep South soul honestly. Her musical roots began while singing in gospel choirs at church. A stint living in nearby college town Chapel Hill introduced her to many different styles of music and the awareness of music (and more importantly, unique and non-mainstream music) as a possible career. After hooking up with her guitar-playing husband Matt Hill, the pair relocated to St. Louis, Missouri, where they have established themselves within the local blues circuit.

Recently creating a whirlwind of excitement following her performances at the Viva Las Vegas festival (the largest roots music festival in the United States), Nikki Hill is currently anticipating the release of her first recording. Following the release of her debut effort, Hill plans to tour the United States and Europe, spreading her message of down-home, dirty R&B to believers and new converts everywhere. If you haven't heard of her yet, prepare for your 'whiplash moment'—you have been warned. Nikki Hill has arrived.

# Preservation Plea from Lou Curtiss

Owner Folk Arts Rare Records Lou Curtiss, owner of Folk Arts Records, and Russ Hamm are working on the Digitalization of the *Lou Curtiss Sound Library* with copies going to The Library of Congress and The UCLA Ethnomusicology Archives. They have finished about 540 reels (the first 400 were courtesy of a grant from the GRAMMY people, the rest are sort of hand to mouth). They have to put them on high-end DVDs and those cost money. They've say down to about \$300 in the bank and fund raising is sadly lacking.

The local performing community has done a couple of benefits but they need a fund raising/grant writing apparatus in place to finish this job. They also need a non-profit corporation status for the fund raising effort. There's about 2500 reels or so to go. Lou says, "traditional and Roots music is the stepchild of the Arts Community. That's particularly so in San Diego. How about helping to make this stepchild story have a Cinderella ending."


