like to pay honor where it's due. Being a blues musician as well having that genre and it's roots entrenched into my life for many, Imany years, I deeply respect where the blues came from and where it's going. I cherish the work done by the forefathers as well as the frontrunners of this music, this lifestyle if you will, longing for a blues fix and the passion and truth that lies within. I can't help but associate Black History Month with the Blues.... and that's a part of American History. Not only the unimaginable struggles that raised it and named it but the figures that many associate it with like W.C. Handy, Robert Johnson, Son House, Huddie Ledbetter, Charley Patton, Maime Smith, Willie Dixon, Ma Rainey, Muddy Waters and on but all those that left indelible footprints.

Obviously blues musicians are not even the tip of the iceberg of why this month of observance was created and we do honor them no matter the month... not black, not white, just blues. But, for me anyway, this month brings even more focus to the path that has carried the blues.

Grossmont college's Black History Month Planning Committee has lined up multiple events, including a rare opportunity to join two celebrated musicians - the Queen of the Kansas City Blues Jeannie Cheatham and legendary jazz artist John Handy. They talk about their lives, careers and craft from 2-3:30 p.m. Thursday, Feb.



21, at Griffin Gate in Grossmont College's student center. presentation, dubbed "Day of Giants," is free and open to the public.

Cheatham is a pianist, composer and author whose full-throated vocals and rousing barrelhouse piano led her to perform with rhythm and blues icon Big Mama Thornton for a decade, and in the '80s, to tour with Cab Calloway. Sweet Baby Blues, her debut album with her late husband Jimmy Cheatham, was

awarded the Grand Prix du Disque de Jazz, the French equivalent of a Grammy. The album, which includes "Meet Me With Your Black Drawers On," is regarded as a blues classic.

John Handy, whose soulful and fiery saxophone style is instantly recognizable to generations of jazz fans worldwide, has performed in the world's great concert halls. ~ Michele Lundeen 🕳

2013 IBC Winners...

The Blues Foundation's 29th International Blues Challenge concluded Saturday, Feb 2, 2013, with an afternoon twin bill at the Orpheum Theatre in Memphis, TN.

The solo/duo winner was **Little G Weevil**, sponsored by Atlanta Blues Society and second place honors went to the **Suitcase Brothers** from the Barcelona Blues Society in Spain.

The top prize in the Band competition was awarded to the **Selwyn Birchwood Band** (pictured at right) of the Suncoast Blues Society. Second place honors were earned by **Michael van Merwyk and Bluesoul**, German Blues Network, and the third spot went to **Dan Treanor's Afrosippi Band with Erica Brown**, hailing from the Colorado Blues Society.

A beautiful custom Gibson ES-335 guitar featuring The Blues Foundation's logo and a Category five amp was awarded to Selwyn Birchwood as the band finals top guitarist.

Judges determined the Best Self-Produced CD to be Society Solo Recordings Steve Hill of Montreal Blues.

CD/DVD Reviews



LIVE AT THE 55 ARTS CLUB BERLIN Lucky Peterson feat. Tamara Peterson Blackbird Music

Lucky Peterson was born to play the blues. His father, bluesman James Peterson, owned a

nightclub in Buffalo called The Governor's Inn. The club was a regular stop for fellow bluesmen such as Willie Dixon. Dixon saw a five-year-old Lucky Peterson performing at the club and, in Peterson's words, "Took me under his wing."

Lucky began performing on national television soon thereafter. He has been wowing audiences ever since with his mastery of the Hammond B-3 organ and guitar. Though his career was sidelined at times by his struggles with addiction, this new release gives ample evidence that he is now back at the top of his game.

This release is packaged as three DVDs and two CDs. DVD one is the first set performance, DVD 2 is the second set performance, and the third DVD is "extras," including interviews and performances by the band without the Petersons. The CDs match the music performed on the DVDs.

The band consists of Lucky on vocals, guitars, Hammond B3 and keyboards; Shawn Kellerman, guitars; Tim Waites, bass; and Raul Valdes on drums. Their delivery is tight, and Lucky engages the initially staid German crowd by strolling through the club with his guitar and sitting on people's laps. \


Especially moving is Lucky's performance of Ray Lamontagne's "Trouble," a beautiful song with personal significance for Lucky. When he brings out his lovely wife Tamara toward the middle of each set, the crowd goes wild. Though she performs in a jazzier vein, her interaction with Lucky onstage is priceless. Each set is nearly 80 minutes long, and there is never a dull moment.

Excellent performances by all and sterling production values make this is a wonderful addition to any blues lover's library. ~ Janine Harty

STILL LIVE 2012

Colin Linden

Being a guitarist myself, I am very particular about what I like, but this guy has got it going on. The first thing that got me was his haunting yet uniquely soulful and honest voice. Colin Linden is also a great guitarist who knows his way around the blues. Although his arrangements are not your typical blues



arrangements, they are his and they are surprisingly refreshing to hear.

Still Live 2012 starts off with "Big Mouth," which is a cool, bluesy arrangement favoring the slide and his tone is sweet. Colin does a fine version of Willie Dixon's "Who's Been Talking" which is the only cover on this 12 track album. "Between Darkness And The Light Of Day" is very reminiscent of Elvis Costello. His finger style/slide approach is great on "Sugar Mine" and "Smoke Em All." This is a live album and that's how it sounded that night and I can't wait to hear him live someday. I'm now a big fan and really dig this album and I think you will too. Check it out for yourself. ~ Steve Burns

BUDDY GUY LIVE AT LEGENDS

Buddy Guy

Silvertone Records/RCA Records

This album should be called "Buddy Guy Live, Live, LIVE!" Buddy steps out and delivers the explosive performance that you've experienced if



you've ever attended one of his live shows. With a big grin in his voice, he exclaims to the audience in the midst of one track, "I love what I'm doing!" That goes without saying.

This December, 2012 release consists of his January, 2010, live recordings at his original Legends Club in Chicago, before he moved the Club to its new site, plus three previously unreleased studio tracks. Every cut is a good one.

Sharing the stage at Legends are band members Tim Austin on drums, Orlando Wright on bass, Ric Hall on second guitar, and Marty Sammon on keyboards. Together, they work new excitement into old favorites: Mannish Boy, I Just Want To Make Love To You, Damn Right I Got the Blues, a medley of Boom Boom and Strange Brew, and Voodoo Chile (a nearly complete version!), mingled with Strange Brew. Also included in the live set are Skin Deep and Best Damn Fool. The studio tracks are equally good, ending with a version of Country Boy that's as magically beautiful

as Muddy Waters' original recording, a drawling, droning number spiked with an electric undercurrent. On the studio tracks, he's joined by Austin guitarist David Grissom, Reese Wynans (Double Trouble) on keyboards, and accomplished bassist Michael Rhodes, with Tom Hambridge on drums

You need this CD. For the incredible price of \$9.99 (Amazon.com), I guarantee that you'll have at least \$99.99 of musical enjoyment. You'll be playing it over and over. $\sim DM$


