

I saw this little dynamo for the first time at the Sin City Soul & Blues Revival in Las Vegas last Fall and I thought she and her band were extremely entertaining. She pays guitar, sings her butt off and even plays trumpet, plus her band kills. Tickets for this show are \$30 each or a booth for six is \$200.

The following night, **January 25, Kim Simmonds & Savoy Brown** will bring their classic blues rock experience to Ramona. Tickets for this show range \$25, \$30, \$45 and \$250 for a booth.

**Friday, February 7** will be the **Kenny Wayne Shepherd** band. This is a "standing room only" show for \$60 general admission tickets or pay \$500 for a booth for six.

**Saturday, February 15. Eric Sardinas** will also surely tear it up. Tickets are \$25 or \$200 for a booth for six.

Wanna jump, jive and wail? See swing revival band, **Big Bad Voodoo Daddy Friday, February 21.** Tickets are \$40 or \$275 for a booth for six.

Saturday, March 8 you can catch Smokin' Joe Kubek & B'nois King. Tickets are \$30 or \$250 for a booth for six.

Thursday, April 3, Johnny Winter will be slidin' in. Tickets are \$40 or \$275 for a booth for six. Friday, April 4 it's Joe Louis Walker. Tickets are





### **AMSD Concert to feature Guy Davis**



uy Davis will be appearing in Friday, February 7 at AMSD Concerts at 7:30pm. Tickets are \$20, \$28, and \$47 for the Dinner Package. Those that caught Guy's previous AMSD show said, "Guy Davis was without a doubt the best performance I have ever attended. What a charismatic person, very funny -- an amazing musician and performer," and "We've enjoyed a lot of great concerts at AMSD and Guy Davis rates up there with the best!"

AllMusicGuide rates all of Guy Davis' albums as 4 or 5 stars (out of 5). Guy's most recent album, *Juba Dance* was number one on the Roots & Blues Music Report charts for six straight weeks. Philadelphia's *City Paper* just picked the album as Roots Album of the year. Davis has released nine acclaimed albums on Redhouse Records and been nominated for nearly a dozen blues awards including Best Acoustic Blues Artist and Best Acoustic Blues Album. He also self-

released *Audio Play*, a two-CD collection of his one-man play, *The Adventures of Fishy Waters*.

Guy's influences are as broad and varied as his travels, from Blind Willie McTell and Fats Waller, to Buddy Guy and Taj Mahal, from Zora Neale Hurston, Garrison Keillor, to Ossie (his father) and Laura (his grandmother) Davis. He's a musician, composer, actor, director, and writer who blends all of his experiences to convey his love of the music.

He has received accolades and praise for his performance off-Broadway as the legendary Robert Johnson in *Robert Johnson: Trick The Devil*, winning the Blues Foundation's "Keeping the Blues Alive Award." Likewise, he received rave reviews for his appearance on Broadway in *Finian's Rainbow*, playing the part originally played by the legendary Sonny Terry in the 1947 production.



### CD Review....



#### AN ACOUSTIC EVENING AT THE VIENNA OPERA HOUSE Joe Bonamassa J&R Adventures

ne minute into this album, guitar players will be lusting after a Martin D41 and the talent to play it like Joe Bonamassa. Being a guitar aficionado, Joe gives the 12 guitars (mostly Martins and Gibsons) he used during the 2-CD recording, their own page in the liner notes.

Tightly incorporated into each of the songs are the ultratalented co-performers, complementing his guitar and vocals with their stringed and percussive instruments. The superb sound quality of the recording in the Vienna Opera House sets up the performances like diamonds in a ring. The result is a beautiful album.

Joe Bonamassa is so prolific in his album releases that you might think the material here would be repetitious. Instead, he reinterprets his classics with new inspiration drawn from the acoustic opportunity. He's also sparked by the dynamics and interactions with renowned musicians Lenny Castro on various percussion instruments, Gerry O'Connor (Irish Rovers) on fiddle and banjo, Mats Wester on nyckelharpa and mandola and Arlan Schierbaum on harmonium, accordion, piano and glockenspiel.

The songs are familiar, but reinvented. Among others, "The Ballad of John Henry," "Sloe Gin," "Woke Up Dreaming," "Dislocated Boy," "High Water Everywhere," "Slow Train," and old blues favorites, such as "Stones in My Passway" and "Jelly Roll" are transformed into new and exciting, mystical and moving pieces. Those of you who caught his acoustic set opening for himself at his recent San Diego show will remember the similarly awesome performance the band gave that night.

It was definitely a good idea to preserve this live, *Acoustic Evening*, carefully rehearsed and stunningly executed, on CD's, rather than let it evaporate into the night. It really stands alone, above 99% of the other releases on the market. ~ DM



# Ronnie Earl and the Broadcasters Stream Live Jan. 25

hanks to your computer and a website called "Concert Window," you can watch Ronnie Earl and the Broadcasters streaming live from their concert in Portland, Maine, at 5 p.m. Pacific Time (8 p.m. EST), January 25. http://www.concertwindow.com/shows/2579-ronnie-earl-and-the-broadcasters.

Concert Window allows musicians to expand their audience by broadcasting their live performances over the internet on a payper-view (pay what you want) basis. Although few blues performers have been among the artists taking advantage of the concept so far, Ronnie Earl, Ruthie Foster (upcoming Jan. 31), the Blues Broads, and Mark Hummel have all made appearances.

Sign up in advance by opening an account, creating a password, and making your payment for the show. Then, on Jan 25, log onto the site 10 minutes before the show (reload, if you get there too early). Don't expect a Hollywood-level of technical sophistication. They've got one camera trained on the stage, but It's a full concert, from setup to tear-down, and it's definitely live. It's a good opportunity for bands to draw wider audience coverage, and for the audience to hear live music from bands who haven't scheduled local tour stops.



### January 20 we celebrate Martin Luther King Jr.

Tanuary 20 is a federal holiday set aside to celebrate the life and accomplishments of Martin Luther King Jr. To some, it's a day of service. To others, it's about remembrance. And to many, it's about education. In the eleven-year period between 1957 and 1968, King traveled over six million miles and spoke over twenty-five hundred times, appearing wherever there was injustice, protest, and action; he was awarded five honorary degrees; was named



Man of the Year by Time magazine in 1963; and became not only the symbolic leader of American blacks but also a world figure. At the age of thirty-five, Martin Luther King, Jr., was the youngest man to have received the Nobel Peace Prize. He was assassinated in Memphis, TN April 4, 1968.

### Upcoming: February is Black History Month and 2014 Marks the 50th Anniversary of the 1964 Civil Rights Act

The month of February is African American History Month, also called Black History Month and every year there's a different theme. The 2014 theme is "The Golden Jubilee of the Civil Rights Act." The theme is announced annually by the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH) in Washington DC.

In 2013, Black History Month celebrated the 50th anniversary of the March on Washington at which Dr. King gave his famous "I Have a Dream" speech. It also marked the 150th anniversary of the Emancipation Proclamation.

To commemorate and celebrate the contributions to our nation made by people of African descent, American historian Carter G. Woodson established Black History Week. The first celebration occurred on Feb. 12, 1926. For many years, the second week of February was set aside for this celebration to coincide with the birthdays of abolitionist/editor Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln. In 1976, as part of the nation's bicentennial, the week was expanded into Black History Month.

The Association for the Study of African American Life and History was established September 9, 1915 and founded by Woodson. Their stated goal "is to promote, research, preserve, interpret and disseminate information about Black life, history and culture to the global community." It is currently located temporarily on the campus of Howard University. www.asalh.org
