



"Heartfelt singing and a merciless guitar with a wicked icy burn... He is one of the truly gifted blues artists of his generation," says Living Blues.


Opening the show are young blues band, Wyatt Lowe & the YoungBloods with special guest Jared James Nichols.

ast year regional, in-demand, drum mainstay, Ric Lee (Bayou Brothers et al), was instrumental is bringing us an amazing drum clinic with industry icon, Bernard Purdie. This year Lee has joined with BLUSD and Mark DeBosky, KSDS Station Manager and director of KSDS Jazz Live, to present an extraordinary glimpse into the music that helped shaped many of the hits we grew up with. Please join us for two very special screenings of the eye-opening movie, *The Wrecking Crew*, at City College's Saville Theater, July 20, in downtown San Diego.

The low cost of admission will benefit 3-fold as Jazz 88 and the Wrecking Crew team have joined together to create the Tedesco Music Scholarship Fund, which will help fund a disadvantaged youth to attend our well-received BLUSD Blues Summer Camp staffed by music professionals.

The truly unsung heroes of rock's early years, the Wrecking Crew were a loosely affiliated group of L.A.-based

session players who played on a stunning array of classic sides. While their contributions were hardly acknowledged on the liner notes of the albums they helped make hits, their stature has only grown with rock fans over the years, and director Danny Tedesco's documentary -- suitably named 'The Wrecking Crew -- serves as a long overdue tribute to the men and women behind the music.


Filmed over a 12-year period, *The Wrecking Crew* has won an array of festival prizes over the last five years, but is still somewhat incredibly unavailable on the home video market, although screenings continue, like the one we are offering here, the film's website is soliciting donations to secure a more substantial release.

"Much like *Standing In the Shadows Of Motown, The Wrecking Crew* tells the inside story of the studio musicians who played on the many hit records recorded in Los Angeles in the 1960s, including songs by The Byrds, The Beach Boys, Sonny & Cher, numerous Phil Spector productions and countless, countless others. Basically examining the music that became "the soundtrack to our lives," this is a nostalgia trip well worth taking." - *Mitch Myers/HighTimes.com*

THAT'S WHEN THE BLUES BEGINS Ruff Kutt Blues Band VizzTone

This a great album for dancers. Every cut flows with a smooth, slinky vibe that will make you feel good. You and your partner will jump to your feet to glide

from song to song on the dance floor.

Anson Funderburgh and James Goode, stellar musicians themselves, have drawn together a cast of blues veterans to form the Ruff Kutt Blues Band. After their sold-out album, Mill City Blues, they've come together again on this new cd, released on May 14. With Anson Funderburgh and Zac Harmon on guitar, Finis Tasby alternating with Zac on vocals, James Goode on bass, Gentleman John Street on keyboards, and Wes Starr on drums, Ron Jones stepping at just the right moments on sax, Steve Richards assisting on vocal harmonies, and Eric Przygocki on unpright bass, this is a band that is well-prepared to deliver the blues.

The strength of *That's When the Blues Begins* is in the expert mixing and production. With such an excellent team of musicians, you would expect that you could just assemble them in the studio, turn them loose, and, voila! You'd have a good album. This cd goes a step further. It stands out in its harmonious blending of the performers' sounds. You can hear each instrument when it should be heard, taking the lead, or supporting and punctuating the others. The result is a smooth, polished sound that accentuates the best of each track. ~ *DM*

UNLEASHED The Hound Kings 9 Below Productions

Hailing from the Bay Area, the newly-formed acoustic trio the Hound Kings consists of vocalist Alabama Mike (AKA Michael Benjamin), guitarist Anthony Paule and harmonica player Scott



Brenton (founder of 9 Below Productions and producer of this recording).

Based in Oakland since 1983, soulful singer Alabama Mike launched his professional music career in 1999, but continued to work primarily as a long-haul trucker. His 2010 release, *Tailor Made Blues* (on which both Paule and Brenton appear), received wide critical acclaim and a nomination for the Blues Foundation's Best Traditional Male Artist award (Charlie Musselwhite won). Shortly thereafter he was stricken with valley fever and was bedridden for a year on a regimen of powerful, debilitating intravenous medication. He recovered just in time to learn that he had been fired from his trucking job, his state disability benefits had expired, and his manager had abandoned him. Needless to say, all of this gave him a wealth of real-life blues material to draw upon.

Nine of the 10 songs on *Unleashed* were co-written by the three band members, and they're all keepers. Although none of the band members ever performed in an acoustic setting before, they sound like they've been doing it their entire lives. Despite his prolonged illness, Alabama Mike is in fine voice and apparently in fine spirits. He recently told a reporter that he considers what happened to him a blessing because he can finally focus on his music full-time, and that's a blessing for us. Do yourself a favor and check these guys out. You'll be glad you did! ~ *Janine Harty*
